You have probably heard about a variety of concerns and issues regarding reopening schools, including the need for such things as wearing NVMI-provided masks, social distancing, cleaning and disinfecting of classrooms, cafeterias, water fountains, bathrooms, and other shared spaces, screening of people for fever and other symptoms – and more. NVMI’s leadership team is working with state and local officials to refine a solid plan for safely returning to school. Because we are located on LAUSD property, we also must ensure we coordinate our efforts with LAUSD, which is a large organization and does not move as adeptly as a small organization such as NVMI. We cannot say for sure right now what the return to school in late August will look like. It will likely involve cancellation of traditional gatherings like parent nights and public athletic events. It may well involve some form of staggering which students come to school which days/weeks. It will likely involve some elements of virtual learning like what we are doing now. We also recognize that some parents may prefer exclusively online learning for their children as a safety precaution; we will be sensitive to that desire as well as the need many families will have for childcare when the economy is being fully reopened. Please know that we will take every appropriate and necessary step to ensure student and staff safety. We promise to keep you all informed as decisions are firmed up. While we remain unclear exactly what classes will look like in the fall, we do want everyone to plan ahead for certain firm dates:

- Students entering grades 6 and 7 will come to orientation on Monday August 17. Times to be announced.
- Students entering grades 8 and 9 will come to orientation on Tuesday August 18. Times to be announced.
- Students entering grades 10 and 11 will come to orientation on Wednesday August 19. Times to be announced.
- Students entering grade 12 (and from other grades unable to come earlier in the week) will come to orientation on Thursday August 20. Times to be announced.
- The first day of classes will be Monday August 31. This is later than LAUSD, but NVMI has aligned its calendar with the Los Angeles Community College District and Los Angeles Mission College.

A REMINDER THAT THE NVMI OFFICE IS CLOSED DURING THE COVID-19 STAY AT HOME ORDER, EXCEPT IF YOU MAKE AN APPOINTMENT IN ADVANCE WITH DR. RYAN BY CALLING HIS CELL AT 323-217-4481. When you come to the campus with a prior appointment, please know that:

- Only one family at a time will be permitted on campus and only in the main office; no other part of campus is accessible
- Avoid coming to campus if you have a fever or cough
- No restrooms are available on campus for public use
- Social distancing of at least 6 feet is required
- Face coverings must be worn by everyone on campus
- Hand sanitizer is available in the main office
